Realtor Marsha Bryan moved to Cedaredge 37 years ago. She was looking for a place where the winters were mild and where she could grow a lot of your own food, as well as a good place to raise her two daughters. "When we drove over the Grand Mesa and started to descend where it overlooks the Surface Creek Valley, we knew we had found our perfect paradise," Marsha said. "I have never, ever regretted that move!" Cedaredge is a very special place, and she often tells her clients it's like the fictitious Camelot: it usually rains or snows at night and the sun comes out in the daytime (usually); we have a distinct four seasons here; the winters are mild, with snowfall mostly on the Mesa and not in the Valley; we benefit from that snowfall for our drinking water and irrigation water; we can grow an abundance of food here (and if you don't have the time to grow things, they are very easy to obtain!).



Her nearly 40 years here has seen some changes, but Marsha said Cedaredge is still very peaceful and idyllic and is an excellent place to raise a family with more old fashioned family values that are harder to find in the big cities. "The people here are very special too, and maybe it's the community that brings it out in them, but it's a very strong community of an eclectic mix of people who love and support their community and where everyone is a friend!" she said.

"I have been many places, just like a lot of other people who live here have, and have discovered there's no place better than right here in Cedaredge! Even the allure of Maui, Hawaii (where I've also lived twice) is not enough to make me give up this special place on the planet!" she said.
